Notice of Privacy Practices

Your Information.

Your Rights.

Our Responsibilities.

This notice describes how health information about you may be used and disclosed, your rights with respect to your health information, and how to file a complaint concerning a violation of the privacy or security of your health information or of your rights concerning your information.

Please review it carefully.

You have a right to a copy of this notice (in paper or electronic form) and to discuss with the Executive Director of Quality and Compliance at 360-678-7656 ext. 6304 if you have questions.

Your Rights

When it comes to your health information, you have certain rights.

This section explains your rights and some of our responsibilities to help you.

Get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record:

- You can ask to see or get an electronic or paper copy of your medical record and other health information we have about you. Ask us how to do this.
- We will provide a copy or a summary of your health information, no later than 15 days from your request, unless permitted or required by law. We may charge a reasonable, cost-based fee.

Ask us to correct your medical record:

- You can ask us to correct health information about you that you think is incorrect or incomplete. Ask us how to do this.
- We may say “no” to your request but we will tell you why in writing within 45 days.

Request confidential communication

- You can ask us to contact you in a specific way (for example, home or office phone) or to send mail to a different address.
- We will say “yes” to all reasonable requests.

Ask us to limit what we use or share

- You can ask us not to use or share certain health information for treatment, payment, or our operations, including after you have previously provided written consent. *(We are not required to agree to your request, and we may say “no” if it would affect your care.)*
- If you pay for a service or health care item out-of-pocket in full, you can ask us not to share that information for the purpose of payment or our operations with your health insurer. *(We will say “yes” unless a law requires us to share that information.)*

Get a list of those with whom we have shared information

- You can ask for a list (accounting) of the times we have shared your health information for six years prior to the date you ask, who we shared it with, and why.
- We will include all the disclosures except for those about treatment, payment, and health care operations, and certain other disclosures (such as any you asked us to make). We'll provide one accounting a year for free but will charge a reasonable, cost-based fee if you ask for another one within 12 months.

Get a copy of this privacy notice

- You can ask for a paper copy of this notice at any time, even if you have agreed to receive the notice electronically and we will provide you with a paper copy.

Choose someone to act for you

- If you have given someone medical power of attorney or if someone is your legal guardian, that person can exercise your rights and make choices about your health information.
- We will make sure the person has this authority and can act for you before we take any action.

File a complaint if you feel your rights are violated

- You can complain if you feel we have violated your rights by contacting us using the information on the back page.

Your Choices

For certain health information, you can tell us your choices about what we share.

If you have a clear preference for how we share your information in the situations described below, talk to us. Tell us what you want us to do, and we will follow your instructions.

In these cases, you have both the right and choice to tell us to:

- Share information with your family, close friends, or others involved in your care
- Share information in a disaster relief situation
- Include your information in a hospital directory

(If you are not able to tell us your preference, for example if you are unconscious, we may go ahead and share your information if we believe it is in your best interest. We may also share your information when needed to lessen a serious and imminent threat to health or safety.)

In these cases we never share your information unless you give us written permission:

- Marketing purposes
- Sale of your information
- Most sharing of substance use disorder records and psychotherapy notes

In the case of fundraising:

- We may contact you for fundraising efforts, but you can tell us not to contact you again. For certain fundraising activities, we may contract you only if you are provided with an opportunity to opt-out of such communications.
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Our Uses and Disclosures

How do we typically use or share your health information?

We generally share your health information in the following ways: We will only use or share substance use disorder information about you for these purposes pursuant to your written consent.

To treat you:

- We can use your health information and share it with other professionals who are treating you. Treatment disclosures may also occur when we use an electronic health system to access or exchange information with providers outside WhidbeyHealth, or utilize artificial intelligence ("AI") to support your care. You have the ability to opt out.

Example: A doctor treating you for an injury asks another doctor about your overall health condition.

To run our organization:

- We can use and share your health information to run our practice, improve your care, and contact you when necessary.

Example: We use health information about you to manage your treatment and services.

To bill for services:

- We can use and share your health information to bill and get payment from health plans or other entities.

Example: We give information about you to your health insurance plan so it will pay for your services.

Our Uses and Disclosures

How else can we use or share your health information?

We are allowed or required to share your information in other ways — usually in ways that contribute to the public good, such as public health and research. We have to meet many conditions in the law before we can share your information for these purposes. For more information see: www.hhs.gov/ocr/privacy/hipaa/understanding/consumers/index.html

Help with public safety issues:

- We can share your health information for certain situations such as:
 - *Preventing disease*
 - *Helping with product recalls*
 - *Reporting adverse reactions to medications*
 - *Reporting suspected abuse, neglect, or domestic violence*
 - *Preventing or reducing a serious threat to anyone's health or safety*

Do research:

- We can use or share your health information for health research.

Comply with the law:

- We will share your information if state or federal laws require it, including with the Department of Health and Human Services if it wants to see if we are in compliance with federal privacy law.

Respond to organ and tissue donor requests:

- We can use or share your health information with organ procurement organizations.

Work with a medical examiner or funeral director:

- We can share your health information with a coroner, medical examiner, or funeral director when an individual dies.

Address workers' compensation, law

- *We can use or share your health information for:*
 - *Workers' compensation claims*

<i>enforcement and other government requests:</i>	- Law enforcement purposes or for a law enforcement official - Health oversight agencies for activities authorized by law - Special government functions, such as military, national security and presidential protective services
<i>Respond to lawsuits and legal actions:</i>	• We will share your information in response to a court or administrative order, or in response to a subpoena unless you object. • We will not share certain protected health information about you, including reproductive health information, in response to a subpoena or other legal process unless allowed under Washington law.
<i>Substance use disorder records</i>	• We will not use or disclose certain substance use disorder records or testimony relaying the content of such records in civil, criminal, administrative, or legislative proceedings unless you provide written consent, or based on a court order after you are provided notice and an opportunity to object.
<i>Artificial Intelligence</i>	• We may utilize AI for the uses and disclosures described in this notice. In certain circumstances, you have the right to opt out.

Please note:

WhidbeyHealth Medical Center and all WhidbeyHealth Clinics provide patients access to their personal medical records through the patient portals. Records are securely stored on the WhidbeyHealth network.

- *We are required by law to maintain the privacy and security of your protected health information.*
- *We will let you know promptly if a breach occurs that may have compromised the privacy or security of your information.*

- *We must follow the duties and privacy practices described in this notice and give you a copy of it.*
- *We will not use or share your information other than as described here unless you tell us we can in writing. If you tell us we can, you may change your mind at any time. Let us know in writing if you change your mind.*
